A Workshop cum interaction programme was organized on 'Livelihood generation through natural resources for local community' for celebration of 'Birsa Munda Anniversary' under Azadi ka Amruit Mahotsava ' at Rani Durgawati Samadhi , Narai village on 17th November, 2021 . The event was inaugurated by Mrs. Neelu Singh, Scientist 'G' & Director, TFRI by worshipping of the great Birsa Mundaji's Photo and Shri Girdharilal Patel, Sarpanch of the village. The Lamp was lightened by the Dignitories including Dr.Fatima Shirin, Head & Scientist 'G, Genetics & Tree Improvement Division and Dr. Nanita Berry, Scientist 'E' and Head of Forest extension division.

Smt. Neelu Singh informed about the journey of Birsa Mundaji and his devotion towards JanJatiya Samaj' and his noble work paid to the society for their upliftment. She also elaborated about the TFRI's research activities which are useful for the conservation of Forest and Forest products including rare and endangered Medicinal Plants. The institute is also working for the upliftment of poor tribal communities by providing number of training on NTFPs collection, cultivation, sustainable harvesting, bamboo cultivation and its promotion through site specific agroforestry models. The dignitaries also worshipped Rani Durgawati Samadhi which is famous for her devotion during the freedom war for the Gondwana Community. The Sarpanch and other locals are interested to conserve these valuable forest including NTFPs but they need guidance by the TFRI.
